



Land Management Intern – Sharpe Reservation

Position Summary

The Fresh Air Fund (FAF) and Hudson Highlands Land Trust (HHLT) seek to fund two Invasive Species Management Interns for Summer 2021. The interns will also work remotely with a team of interns at the Vassar Ecological Preserve. The interns will perform invasive species inventories, assessment, monitoring, and control on the FAF Sharpe Reservation (2,000 acres) and the HHLT Granite Mountain Preserve (415 acres). Under supervision of the facilities managers, student intern(s) will assist in managing the diverse natural systems on the property to include: controlling and removing invasive plant species in target areas; monitoring wildlife populations of invasive pest of hemlocks and ash trees; completing assessments of specified areas; assistance in creation of an Invasive Species Management Plan; creation of educational outreach videos and materials. Interns will receive hands-on experience in natural areas management to further the development of the intern(s) towards their professional trajectory. This position is designed to ground the individual with professional skill-sets related to ecological land management while improving ecosystem health in the Hudson Valley.

This is an in-person residential position based at Sharpe Reservation in Fishkill, NY. This role reports to the Assistant Director of Sharpe Reservation.

Employment period: 8 weeks, from the beginning of July through August.

Hours per week: Up to 20-40 hours per week with a flexible schedule

Compensation: \$14/hour. Housing will be provided on-site as well as limited meals.

Benefits: None.

Qualifications

- Earning or recently completed a degree in Natural Sciences, Biology, Botany, Environmental Studies, Sustainability or related field.
- Basic knowledge of ecology.
- Good communication and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to use hand tools.
- Ability to follow monitoring protocols, collect accurate data, and maintain data in an organized fashion.
- Valid Driver's License and personal transportation.
- Desire to learn.
- Previous experience with invasive species management is desirable but not required.
- Ability to perform tasks requiring physical exertion, outdoors, in all weather conditions and on difficult terrain.
- Must be able to lift 50 pounds.



- Ability to stand, stoop, bend and carry loads.
- Must be able to work in rain, heat, buggy conditions, etc. and traverse steep ravine slopes.
